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
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FROM THE CHAIR

INTRODUCTION

Looking at 1WAY FM's website I see the following statements:

- (a) Vision: Promoting a Christian perspective across our community.
- (b) Mission: Making Christ relevant in the world today by presenting real stories by real people in real time.
- (c) Statement of Purpose: 1WAY FM presents a Christian message of hope and encouragement to our listeners.
- (d) Our Values: 1WAY FM aims to create a station environment governed by the values of: Faith, Hope, Love, Humility, Wisdom and Servanthood.



As the Christian radio station here in Canberra, the Nation's capital, we have an opportunity to reach and touch people with the message of God's invitation of reconciliation towards the people of this nation (as well as all people).

This 2019 1WAY FM annual report demonstrates how 1WAY FM has been involved in our Christian community and equally how we have presented the Christian message of hope and encouragement to our listeners, whoever they be.

Hi, I'm David Lee and this is my first year as chairman of 1WAY FM (CCRL). I would like to thank Brett Anderson who served as Chair for the last ten years. Brett has guided and seen through many initiatives here at the station during the last ten years and has faithfully and studiously worked hard to see many projects through to completion (many of which are mentioned later here).

I have been involved with 1WAY FM since about 1995 when I first started speaking behind the microphone, often with and trained by our founder, the late Warren Rout. Over the decades I have been on nearly all shifts. I still maintain my microphone presence as it keeps me in contact with people, issues, society, events, trends and it strengthens my faith too.

At the AGM of 2018, seven members were elected as directors in accordance with the CCRL Articles of Association. All directors remained current through the term of this Board. Susan Bruce has continued in the role of Company Secretary, ensuring that our legislative obligations are met.

On behalf of our members, I would also like to extend a thanks to each of our Board members.

OUR FINANCIAL POSITION

Our financial results this year are significantly improved over last year. Our appeal this year "Sharing Faith, Bringing Hope - June Appeal 2019" ended up with a tremendous result from you, Canberrans, Queanbeyanites, Jerrabomberrans, Uriarrans and surrounding populations giving very generously. We were in awe of your commitment to the vision of 1WAY FM. Thank you to all who continue to support the Station financially as members, donors and sponsors. These finances are critical to keeping the station on air and your support ensures the ongoing viability of Christian community radio in the Canberra region. The world needs to hear the message of Jesus.

2019

2019 saw several developments.

Broadcasting from Black Mountain Tower (BMT):

The Board, led by Brett Anderson over the last two years, committed to broadcasting our 91.9 frequency from Black Mountain Tower. This has significantly improved the coverage, quality, strength and reliability of the 91.9 signal to the Canberra/ACT region. This transfer occurred in July and apart from an occasional dropout, the system is working well. Our coverage has improved not only in area, but in reaching black spots from our previous transmitter on Poppet Hill. We also have a long-term security of tenure at BMT. All this comes at a slightly increased cost, but we are believing for support from our members, sponsors, partners and others.

We continue to broadcast to the Tuggeranong valley on 94.3 from Isaacs Ridge.

Digital radio:

Digital radio for the community radio stations here in Canberra is being planned for release in the near future. We are working with the other community stations, Community Broadcasting Association of Australia and the relevant Government authority.

Licence renewal:

As is required every five years, we submitted our licence renewal documentation this year. A sterling effort from Jenny Anderson, staff, board members and volunteers considering all the digital paperwork required.

Premises:

Southside Lighting, who own the building in which we have our studios, is closing down. We have commenced conversations with the prospective new owners as they are awaiting final approvals from the government regarding their development application. We are hopeful that we will be able to remain in our current location following the sale of the premises. Developments will be posted on our website when we know more definitely.



OUR STRATEGIC PLAN 2018 - 2020

In mid-2019, the Board reviewed and updated our strategic goals and strategies to ensure we are achieving our purpose and that our 1WAY FM team has clear strategic direction to follow to achieve our 2020 Vision. Segments of the Strategic Plan 2018-2020 are included in this report. The full Strategic Plan can be downloaded from our website or obtained through the 1WAY FM office.

THE YEAR AHEAD: 2020.

On behalf of the CCRL Board, thank you to our 1WAY FM team, our members, sponsors, listeners and supporters for your encouragement over this last year. 1WAY FM has a strong future ahead because of your investment. We are well equipped to meet any challenge, and we know that in Jesus we have all the strength we need to succeed, though at times, as Brett mentioned last year, we can only trust in Him and He will guide and assist us as we do HIS work.

ABOUT US

Canberra Christian Radio Limited (CCRL) was incorporated in February 1991.

Initially broadcasting as Rhema FM Canberra, CCRL took advantage of Temporary Community Broadcast Licences (TCBLs) that allowed broadcasts for limited hours. It shared frequencies with other community radio broadcasters seeking a permanent community broadcasting licence in the Canberra Region.



The early transmissions were from Black Mountain Tower on 105.5 and the studios were at Suite 2 (First Floor) 53 Bowman Street Macquarie. In late 1996 the Station had to move to a demountable building at the Canberra Church of Christ in Belconnen because of high accommodation costs in Macquarie. Around this time the Station was transmitting on 107.1 and it also had a translator transmitting from a house in Southern Canberra.

In 2000, Rhema FM Canberra was the second United Christian Broadcasters (UCB) affiliated station in Australia to get a permanent community radio broadcasting licence for religious purposes. Not long after, CCRL changed the Station name to 1WAY FM in line with the Station's call sign: 1WAY.

Since then, 1WAY FM has been broadcasting a Christian message to Canberra and surrounding regions 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Today 1WAY FM broadcasts on 91.9 and on 94.3 in Tuggeranong as well as streaming online and is very thankful for our studios in Fyshwick.

1WAY FM is well positioned as a valuable part of the Canberra region. We seek to become a vibrant, thriving community radio station that is well-resourced, characterised by professionalism, relevant and visible in our community, to ensure that we can keep providing a Christian message of hope and encouragement every day.

We live in an "insta-world" where people are inundated with information. As a community radio station, we help people sort through the information overload. We support people in the local region as they grow in their Christian faith. We have the opportunity, because of our relationships with Christian support organisations, to raise awareness of the needs in our region. We are influencers in our society, to help connect people and reduce isolation in our community, supporting those who are marginalised and those in need.

We believe that by promoting a Christian perspective across our region and encouraging our listeners and supporters to live lives embodying the station's core values of faith, hope, love, humility, wisdom and servanthood we will have a positive impact on the wider community while helping to reflect a sense of Australian identity, character and cultural diversity.

2020 VISION

1WAY FM:

is a vibrant thriving Christian community radio station that is relevant and visible in the community;

has strong relationships with our Christian community and is widely recognised as a valuable part of the broader community;

is an organisation characterised by innovation and professionalism; and

has a diverse well-resourced team supported by a strong collaborative culture and sense of purpose.

OUR APPROACH:

To become a vital part of the community in our local region that is relevant, connected and engaged, we seek to:

- Interact closely with our community of interest;
- Understand current issues and present them in a Christian context;
- Showcase, through our on-air content, the work that Christ is doing in our community;
- Partner with local Churches, organisations and ministries to unify and amplify God's work in our community;
- Encourage interaction, collaboration, collegiality and unity of purpose within the Christian community;
- Publicise events in our local region that are of interest to our community;
- Promote local content; stories, artists and news; and
- Leverage our corporate social responsibility.

OUR GOALS FOR 2018–2020

Goal 1: Stabilise our financial position to ensure we remain sustainable

The current economic climate poses some challenges for not-for-profit organisations who rely on donations and other discretionary funding to meet their operational requirements. To ensure that 1WAY FM is adequately funded to maintain a stable financial position we need to focus on maximising our revenue-raising opportunities and developing new sources of sustainable income.

Goal 2: Ensure accessibility and reliability of our transmission by addressing issues with signal strength, coverage and the reliability of our broadcast transmission equipment

To be effective as a radio station, 1WAY FM needs to ensure that our signal can be picked up reliably across our licence area. Poor signal strength, patchy coverage and technical failure in some of our equipment has reduced our effectiveness and has potentially resulted in a loss of listeners or poor listener engagement. Addressing these issues and ensuring ongoing maintenance of our technical environment is paramount to our success.

Goal 3: Enrich our on-air content and listener experience

Cutting through the noise. 1WAY FM recognises that people are bombarded with information, requests and demands on their time every day. To be heard amongst this noise 1WAY FM needs to offer a credible, reliable, relevant source of content that appeals to our listeners.

Goal 4: Develop and expand our volunteer team

1WAY FM recognises the value of the involvement of our community of interest across all aspects of our business. As we seek to grow our organisation we need to focus on developing our skills and expanding our volunteer team.

Goal 5: Build strong relationships with our community

The heart of 1WAY FM is to focus on relationships and to promote a Christian perspective through both our on-air content and by connecting our listeners in to local church and community groups in the Canberra region. It is in connection with local Churches and other ministries that the vision of 1WAY FM is fulfilled, therefore it is important to facilitate a common vision and find common ground on which we can support each other's activities.

Goal 6: Explore emerging technologies to reach our listener base more effectively

1WAY FM recognises the need to be aware of emerging technologies that our listeners are engaging with and to employ those technologies that can reach them more effectively.

SECURING OUR FUTURE



FUNDRAISING APPEALS

During 2018-2019, we held two fundraising appeals. The first was held in September 2018 with the theme “All In”. We changed our messaging this year to invite people to fund “hours of radio” rather than just appealing for finances. This was much easier to talk about on air and people found it very easy to connect with. It costs about \$50 an hour (\$1200 a day), to run 1WAY FM.

It was great to see so many volunteers, members and listeners come through the station or get in touch over the course of the appeal weekend. There was a great atmosphere of peace, hopeful expectation and support through the station during the appeal. Over the appeal period, we had 235 contributions, including partnership receipts for the appeal period. This is a total of \$33,509 or 670.2 hours (44.7% of our target). By the end of September, we had received 307 contributions totalling \$47,041 or 941 hours of radio (63% of our target).

Following that appeal, and after consulting with our auditors, we decided to move our regular appeal to June. Our June appeal, “Sharing Faith, Bringing Hope” was held from 11-14 June, with an additional call-out in the final 24 hours of the financial year. We had 496 donations to this appeal, totalling \$126,731 or 2534.6 hours of radio (84% of our target)! While we didn’t quite reach our target, this was an amazing result. We are very blessed to have the support of our listening community to keep presenting a Christian message of hope and encouragement.

The total contribution of this appeal is not reflected in this year’s financial statements. As we have collected this money to support us for the year ahead, most of the appeal funds are recorded as Income in Advance on our financial statement. This means that we are able to support the loss of grant funding for the first part of the 2019/20 financial year.

God continues to provide for our needs. While we never know what form the support will come in, or where it will come from, it does come. We will continue to be diligent in stewarding what we are given to ensure that we can keep broadcasting in the nation’s capital, bringing stories of faith, hope and love to be a beacon of hope in a world that desperately needs God’s grace.



FINANCIAL ANALYSIS

We have recorded a surplus of \$14,823 for the 2018/19 Financial Year (FY). This is a significant improvement on our previous year and our team should be congratulated on the way they have responded to the financial challenges we have faced. This result is due to an equipment grant from the Digital Radio Project, as well as the successful fundraising appeals alongside careful management of our resources throughout the year.

Profit and Loss



REVENUE

Total revenue this FY decreased by almost \$7,000 on last year, the revenue also came in different ways to previous years. Our grant receipts were up on previous years due to a very successful grant application for the 2018/19 FY as well as an equipment allocation from the Digital Radio Project. Our two major revenue streams, donations and sponsorship, both recorded a downswing this year. Part of this can be attributed to the reallocation of money from the June Appeal to Income in Advance to help pay for the 2019/20 FY. As we were unsuccessful in our grant application for the 2019/20 period, this approach will help to fund the year ahead. A little over \$292,000 in revenue was raised in the 2018/19 financial year to support the Station.

Most revenue for the Station is received through donations. We are very grateful for the donations we receive from individuals, organisations and Church communities throughout the year. For some, a regular financial contribution through our Partner Program provides a convenient way for them to contribute to the ongoing work of the Station. Donations can be processed securely through our website where visitors can also quickly set up an automated recurring donation, and a receipt is emailed to donors automatically when each donation is made. Donations of \$2.00 or more are tax-deductable.



Each year, our fundraising appeals provide a focus point to raise the awareness of our listeners of the opportunity to support the work of the Station financially. We also raise this awareness through on-air messaging in our programming.


Donations this year accounted for 47% of our annual revenue, a percentage that reflects the continued generosity and support of our listeners. Our focused efforts to raise awareness of our financial needs, especially in the second half of the year bolstered strong support. We are deeply grateful to those who contribute financially to ensure that 1WAY FM has the necessary finances to support its work.

Sponsorship is one of the largest revenue generators for 1WAY FM. Our sponsors are businesses and organisations that support community radio and who recognise the value of supporting the community they serve. We are blessed that so many companies have chosen 1WAY FM to help them build their brand awareness through our listening community. Statistics continue to show that radio listeners are significantly more likely to respond to corporate messaging heard on community radio than on commercial stations (Christian Media Australia's Annual National Christian Radio Study, McCrindle Research, March 2019).

EXPENSES

Administration costs and, most significantly, salaries, account for much of our outgoings, with rental expenses the next largest expense.


Most expenses remained relatively consistent with previous years. The drop in administrative costs is most significantly attributable to the decrease in overall salary cost due to a further reduction of overall hours of our paid staff. Our rental expenses for our transmitter site will increase in the year ahead, but with the continued support of our community of interest we will be able to meet the expenses.

ADDITIONAL NOTES


Cash at Bank was reported at \$182,672 at the end of the Financial Year, \$85,000 more than last year. This is due to money from the June Appeal being collected as Income in Advance to pay for the year ahead as our grant application for 2019/20 was not successful.

Opinion

PICNIC IN THE PARK

A Presenter's Perspective, by Alyssa Anderson

On Saturday the 30th of March we had our annual Picnic in the Park. Due to the weather, this event didn't quite go to plan it was raining and cold, but we were so blessed by Vision Christian Fellowship and we got to spend the afternoon in their beautiful church. We had an amazing afternoon joined by Scripture Union ACT who supplied face painting and activities for the kids, Irwin Property, Compassion Australia who brought along their VR goggles and took us on tours around third world countries and showed us some of the amazing work that is happening over there, AC Property Management who were running a colouring in competition throughout that week, and the Salvos, who cooked up a storm!

We were absolutely privileged to have artists Mel Crothers, Greg Cooper, The Faumuis Trio, Mike Holberton and Wayne Kelly come and spend the day with us and share their talents.

Days like Picnic in the Park (or in the Church as it was), remind us that despite the distance we feel sometimes from our faith or our Christian brothers and sisters, we can find connection and a place that we call home. It was a phenomenal experience to be able to see not only the talent of all the people there, but to spend the time in community. The gift of Christian radio is such an amazing one. We get to support local artists and help them start up, we get to share messages of hope and encouragement to people who need it, but what ties it all up in a bow is days like Picnic in the Church where God reminds us how important these times are and how important Christian Radio is in our community.

On the day I got to dance to a young girl's favourite song with her, I got to talk to so many people who in reality I had never met, but in the moment I was talking to them there was a connection between us that I had never thought could be achieved in that timeframe. They told me their life stories; things that they had heard on the station that had given them hope when they needed it, and at the end of the conversation I felt like my world had been completely changed. People always look at me and say "Oh my gosh! You're on radio that's so cool!" Then they ask, "What's the coolest part about being on radio?" I will always think back on these conversations that I've had with people and see how they have altered my life and my response will always be "The connections I get to make every week, and finding out about those connections when I get to see those people at events like Picnic in the Park".

I talk all afternoon to a door, at least that's what it looks and sometimes feels like, but the relationships with people that are being built, that I sometimes don't even realise, are worth so much more than I can express. THAT is what Christian radio is. It is that voice whispering into someone's heart who needs it at just that moment, it is a song that plays at just the right time and it is also that moment when a presenter is reminded that they aren't alone in that studio. It is the moment where we all get to share some time together, whether it be over the air waves or in person, that connection we have in Christ to be there for one another is truly something special.



OUTSIDE BROADCASTS

Outside broadcasts are a great opportunity for our team to get out of the station and in to the community. 
If you have an event coming up, make sure you go to our website and add the details so we can help you promote it.


WORK EXPERIENCE

REFINING OUR PROGRAMMING



LOCAL CONTENT

Our Production Team work tirelessly to bring you a wide range of interesting programs. We continue to play a variety of teaching programs from internationally renowned teachers like Chuck Swindoll, Greg Laurie, Dr Charles Stanley, Joyce Meyer, Dr Michael Youseff and Ravi Zacharias. In addition to this we also have a range of locally produced shows. These include:

ALL THAT JAZZ & BLUES – Neville

For more than ten years the Jazz and Blues program on Saturday nights has featured music from international as well as Australian jazz and blues artists. Kingsley Bruce and I began the program around 2007 with the aim of widening the coverage of genres at 1WAY FM and sharing some of the music from very talented Christian artists. We have been blessed to have local artists such as Linda Tinney and Wayne Kelly play live music on air during our program. We have conducted interviews and played requests. Feedback from listeners has been positive and encouraged us to continue finding more great music.

DEFINITION RADIO – K-man, Oaks & Jabs

Definition Radio is hosted by the K-man, Oaks & Jabs. The show has been on-air locally since 2006, and nationally since 2014. In 2018 it won a CBAA Award for Contribution to Australian Music - Radio Program. This year Definition got added to Steel City Gospel Radio in Gary, Indiana, USA. We play hope-filled music that reaches the unreachable and touches the untouchable with the gospel of Jesus Christ, while also supporting Christians in the hip hop culture. Please pray that more people are reached and encouraged through this program into the future.

FAITH & CULTURE – Danny

Canberra is known for its multicultural vibrancy. Faith & Culture aims to connect the various cultural churches to grow stronger in faith, friendship and love for all.

The mission is to connect, engage, inspire and equip people from different cultures and communities to bring them together as one body in Christ to share God's love. This is reflected in God's word where the scripture from Galatians 3:28 says "There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free, there is neither male nor female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus". We do this by playing multicultural Christian songs (Hindi, Malayalam, Vietnamese, Arabic, Indonesian, Konkani, Kannada and many others). Our tag line is "Everyone deserves music".

We encourage people from all communities to contribute to the show be it their testimonies, cultural songs or musical talent for the glory of God.

GOD'S PROMISES – Glenda

I want to bring to our listeners a daily encounter with the Word of God, focusing specifically on His promises. I am conscious that our listeners could be facing any number of challenges in any one day and want to lift and encourage them using His words. I do not bring any interpretation but let the Holy Spirit do in hearts what He alone can do. God does so want us to live in victory and His promises never fail. They are "Yes and Amen".

HEALING & WHOLENESS – Peter & Jane

The program Healing & Wholeness has been produced locally since September 2010. It grew out of a desire, and prompting from the Lord to see the healing ministry of Jesus discussed and promoted on 1WAY FM. It is sponsored by Victorious Ministry Through Christ [VMTC], an International Healing & Wholeness ministry that trains and equips Christians to pray for healing more effectively in their own churches. Our hope for the future is to see the program appeal to a wider listening audience and hopefully be podcast so that listeners can access the program at a time that best suits them.

INSPIRATIONAL TIME WITH KOB – Eddie

Inspirational Time with KOB was started in September 2014. I have always been involved in community activities and coming to Australia from Europe presented me the opportunity to continue to do my community work for the Lord.

The idea behind it was to inspire the community through African songs and inspirational messages. Inspirational time has drawn a lot of Africans in to listening to 1WAY FM.

I hope that we will win more souls for the Lord through this ongoing program and that more Africans and the multicultural community at large will tune in their numbers to listen to 1WAY FM.



INSPIRATIONAL TIME – Joyce

The goal for the program is to bring beautiful international music combined with a topic that will inspire our listeners to keep growing in their Christian walk. We cover selected topics that are aimed at encouraging our listeners to trust in God in every season of their lives. We invite guests to come along to the show; mainly local pastors or guests with a testimony to share that will inspire 1WAY FM listeners. We use inspiring resources from Christian authors and share them with our listeners.

HEROES OF THE FAITH – Glenda & Allan

This program is focused on bringing stories of those who have done so much to change the world to listeners in the Canberra region. Pastor Allan Davis brings weekly stories of known heroes such as Martin Luther or Mary MacKillop. He includes 'obscure' Christians, making an eclectic mix. He also has programs bringing the stories of people he has come to know personally, which makes the listening very interesting and credible. He highlights how heroes are still with us today. Allan's main aim is to show how most of our heroes did not set out to be heroes; they made or are making a difference by following God's guidance and 'going that extra mile' notwithstanding persecution or ridicule.

MESSAGE FROM A PASTOR – Sue

Message from a Pastor started in February 2017 and brings messages from about 15 churches in our region at present. Since the program's inception we've changed flavours a few times. Many pastors' talks are available from their church websites, we download and edit these for radio, including songs that are representational of the talk content.

The program was conceived with the vision of supplying an inspirational message for those who are sick or are unable to make it to a church service that Sunday morning. The other part of the vision was to encourage Christians who have grown disillusioned by church and prefer not to attend a specific service but enjoy a message from their own lounge chair. We also find it helps those searching for a home church. It allows people to listen to a range of teaching styles and perhaps connect with a pastor they have heard on air and begin attending that church. It is also possible to stream the program and listen from anywhere if you are travelling or on holidays and not able to listen to 1WAY FM on 91.9 or 94.3.

I do hope the program brings good teaching, new insight, encouragement and comfort to all those that tune in to the 8 o'clock hour on Sunday mornings.

PRAYERWORX – Hilary

The idea for the show first started when Howie invited me to join the Breakfast Show for a short segment. My aim is to inspire people, adults and children, to pray from the Word of God and to have faith that prayer works. God hears and God cares. Jesus is real, He is powerful and answers prayers.

I hope that through this program, God can bring the Word of God to people in the nation's capital and that people would be connected to His Word. I hope that the Holy Spirit will touch, awaken and revive people's hearts to desire to know the Lord in a much deeper way, and to desire to read the Word of God and explore a much deeper life of prayer. Dare to believe Him in faith, to answer their prayers and to pray big prayers because He is a big God. I pray for their families, the city and the nation, for God's will to be done here on earth as it is in heaven for the glory of the Lord.

PRIMARY PURPOSE – Pastor Brian Medway

Primary Purpose is hosted by Pastor Brian Medway and started around 25 years ago. Its first season was called "Pray for the City". Originally, the idea was to provide "prayer intelligence" for intercessors around the region.

As the years went by, Pastor Brian felt that there was a need to provide short sequenced content designed to keep the people of God focused on what he figured were the most important issues. Eventually it became known under its present title - Primary Purpose.

The work of the kingdom involves long term strategic commitment. It is a week by week process of making the gospel known, making and multiplying disciples. The most important part of sustaining a long-term commitment is to stay on track and to be continually encouraged. I think therefore one of the names of the Holy Spirit is "Comforter/Encourager". Each day, Pastor Brian aims to provide material that will help people stay focused and keep going.

The church is called by God to do two things: make the fullness of Christ known to the community and preach the gospel to every person. That is the Primary Purpose.
